

The Origin

Dinabandhu Andrews College was founded in 1956 by an order of the Government of India and a concurrent order issued thereafter by the Government of West Bengal. The college is named after Rev. Charles Freer Andrews (1871-1940), a noted educationist and close associate of Rabindranath Tagore and Mahatma Gandhi, who had come to India from England as a Christian missionary and who subsequently identified himself with the cause of social reforms and India's independence. He earned the epithet 'Dinabandhu' for his compassionate services to the poor.

Academic Growth of the College

Infrastructure and Support

Human Resources

Dinabandhu Andrews College had 50 sanctioned teaching posts in the beginning, including one of Principal, one of Vice Principal, ten of Senior Lecturer, twenty-nine of Lecturer, and nine of Demonstrator.

At present, the college has sixty-nine full-time teaching posts including one of Principal. Other teaching posts include two of Librarian, two of Graduate Laboratory Instructor, and twenty-four of State-Aided College Teacher.

Side by side with the posts of teachers, the college had twenty-one sanctioned non-teaching posts in the beginning, including one of Head Clerk, one of Librarian, one of Assistant Librarian, one of Cashier, one of Clerk-cum-Typist, one of Store Clerk, four of Laboratory Assistant, eight of Bearer, one of Durwan, one of Night Watchman, and one of Office Peon. Presently, the number of non-teaching posts is thirty-five.

Profile of the College

College Buildings

The college has three buildings - one three-story building (old building) and a four-story Annex Building. A five-story academic building (Diamond Jubilee Building) has recently been constructed (substantially funded by the Department of Higher Education of the Government of West Bengal), and this building is awaiting inauguration.

College Office

The college office has a carpet area of about 1500 sq. ft. with a number of computers and printers. The college has tied up with a bank for collection of fees from the students through a specific software, and a daily report on the collection of fees is generated by the software itself. The college office serves the students in a variety of ways like approving the applications for university enrolment, approving applications for review & self-inspection, distribution of mark sheets and certificates, etc.

Classrooms and Laboratories

The college has about 50 classrooms including three smart classrooms of different seating capacities ranging from 30 to 200.

All laboratory-based departments have well-equipped laboratories with instruments, equipment, tools, and kits of general and special categories. The laboratories are continuously upgraded by way of inclusion of new and modern instruments along with gradual infrastructural development. The CORONA pandemic in the recent past has had a serious impact on the management of the laboratory infrastructure. The college is currently trying its best to repair the damages caused.

The library is spacious enough to accommodate about 50 students at a time to study during the college hours. A new reading room for the students has recently been added with a view to providing them with the facility of studying without any disturbance. The library is

provided with high-speed internet facility and Wi-Fi connectivity. Reprographic facility has also been extended for all concerned. The college library has a special arrangement with the Blind Boys' Academy of Narendrapur Ramakrishna Mission by which the visually impaired students of this college can use the Braille Library of the said academy.

Computer Centre

The Computer Centre of the college is fully air-conditioned and equipped with all the modern facilities of electronic instruction and Wi-Fi connectivity. The college has a separate centre for learning the basics of Computer Applications such as O-level Diploma, CCC-level Certificate Programme, and different job-oriented modular Computer Certificate Courses against fees at a concessionary rate. The centre is recognized by the National Institute of Electronics and Information technology of the Government of India (formerly Department of Electronics Accredited Computer Courses). The courses taught at this centre are recognized by the Ministry of Education, Government of India, as well as by major public sector undertakings, banks, etc. Moreover, the diplomas/certificates awarded by the affiliating institute of this centre are recognized by the Directorate of Employment of the Government of India.

Teachers' Room

The teachers of Dinabandhu Andrews College use a spacious teachers' room which can accommodate more than 50 teachers and is provided with computers and printers. The teachers' room is Wi-Fi enabled through fibre-optical networking.

Teachers' Reading Room-cum-Conference Room

The Teachers' Reading Room-cum-Conference Room having a seating capacity of 25 with Wi-Fi connectivity is currently in use for the purpose of holding meetings, marking of answer-scripts, doing confidential work including moderation of question papers, etc.

Boys' and Girls' Common Rooms

The Boys' Common Room harbors facilities for indoor games like carrom and table tennis. The Girls' Common Room of the college is so designed that the privacy and security of the girl students are maintained. A sanitary napkin vending machine and an incinerator for safe disposal of sanitary waste are the two special facilities in the Girls' Common Room.

Students' Union

The Students' Union is actively engaged in various activities beneficial to the students. It also organizes several programmes, such as, Saraswati Puja, Iftar Party, Freshers' Welcome, Annual Sports, Annual Fest, celebration of Teachers' Day, etc. The Students' Union, through its activities, upholds the rights of the students and discharges its responsibilities in different forms.

Eco-Friendly Power Back-Up System

The college has set up a 24-hour electricity backup system by putting into operation two electric power generators of capacities 63 and 30 KVA.

NCC Unit

The NCC (National Cadet Corps) Unit of Dinabandhu Andrews College is one of the oldest of its kind among the colleges affiliated with the University of Calcutta. It works under the administrative jurisdiction of the 39 Bengal Battalion. Every year, a number of students participate in various social welfare activities and attend functions of national importance.

SC/ST/Minority Cell

The college has set up an SC/ST/Minority Cell in accordance with the directive of the University of Calcutta [CU Ref.No. DR SCT/533/09(8), dated 20.08.1995] for looking after the interests of the students belonging to SC/ST/Minority categories.

Student Credit Card

The college has a duly constituted Student Credit Card Cell for the execution of the 'Student Credit Card' scheme launched by the Government of West Bengal.

Students' Health Home

The students of the college are entitled to avail themselves of the facilities of the Students' Health Home at a nominal charge

Medical Care Unit

There is a fully equipped infirmary with an attached toilet.

Students' Aid

There is provision for waiving a part of the tuition fees of the meritorious but necessitous students. Differently abled students are eligible for a 100 per cent waiver of tuition fees irrespective of their economic background.

Cheap Store

There is a cheap store that sells books and stationery to the students at a discount.

Scope of 'Open Learning'

Use of Green Energy

Roof-top solar power panels of 20kWp capacity were installed in 2015 with the financial assistance and technical expertise of the West Bengal Renewable Energy Development Agency (WBREDA), Government of West Bengal, and the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Government of India – a major step towards using green energy thereby saving precious natural resources and ensuring a sustainable future for mankind as a whole.

Natural Water Harvesting System

There is a large and well-maintained pond on the college premises, which is a site for natural recharging of ground water. This body of water may be considered as an excellent

example of rainwater harvesting system in a congested, heterogeneous, and urban milieu. It continuously recharges a significant volume of ground water and plays an important role in maintaining the stability of the local hydrological system.
