## Parents Feedback: 2020-21 Question Wise Feedback Statistics and Graphical (Overall bar and Individual pie chart) representation







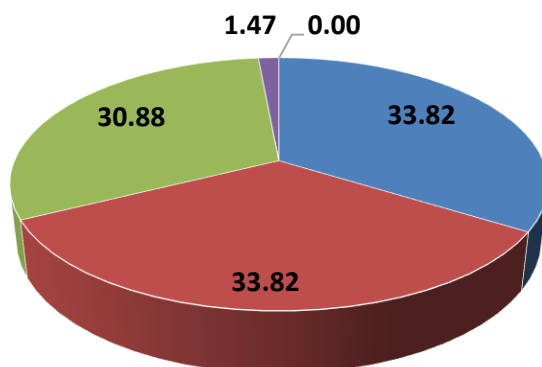
